Soror Jean McGruder Myers was an Original Founding Pearl of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, Inc. in February, 1943, Delta Kappa Chapter, Las Vegas, Nevada. The following are excerpts for "A Pearl's Farewell" Composed by Dr. Willie B. Kennedy written especially for Soror Myers. "For more than sixty-four years she helped move us along. Always insisting that we keep Gamma Phi Delta strong.

Soror Myers was truly a Gamma Phi Delta champ, she taught us not to quit but always try. Soror Myers taught us to achieve the goals we set, that through trusting God our goals would be met, and to everything that Gamma Phi Delta set out to do, we must complete the task always seeing it through. We'll remember how she brought us so much cheer. Her kind, sweet and gentile touch, will be missed by us all who loved her so much".

Soror Myers devoted to her chapter and Gamma Phi Delta Sorority and over the years she held the positions; Supreme Second Anti-Basileus, Supreme Financial Grammateus and National Organizer. Soror Myers taught in schools in Indiana, California, and Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. She traveled extensively with her husband. She attended Green Valley Presbyterian Church and Victory Black Mountain Church in Henderson and volunteered for Catholic Charities and Henderson's Senior Center.
